



## First PLV Week (PLV 1 - Career Service Seminars)

PLVs are practical courses in the form of seminars (PLV) which are organized and held at the university. These must be completed before the start of the practical semester in the 5th semester.

The PLV 1 will be replaced by seven seminars by the Career Service. Every student in the Building Products and Processes programme must participate in four seminars from the "Study and Personal Competencies" category and three seminars from the "Career Competencies" before the internship in the fifth semester. Students can register for the seminars on the Career Service's website under "PLV". After every seminar, the lecturers will sign the confirmation form. After having taken all seven seminars, the form has to be uploaded to the "Career Service PLV Building Products and Processes" course on the iLearn platform. The Career Service will check the form for correctness and completeness and pass the form on to the faculty, so that the successful passing of the PLV 1 can be recorded with the Internship Administration. Students are self-responsible for taking and passing the seminars before their internship begins.
